- Has a desire to learn and will submit high quality work weekly

#### How do I transfer my credits to COHS?

### Step 1:

After you enroll, you will be signed up for our international student orientation course, which is specifically designed to assist international students through the credit transfer process

You will submit your official transcript. Also, if your transcript is not in English you will be asked to complete a form in the course telling us in English the name of the courses you have completed, if any.

## Step 3:

Our Student Service team will review the transcript and compare it to our courses

#### Step 4:

The results of the review are sent to the student and the school will submit a list of remaining courses for the student to take Sample Transcript Evaluation
