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What is Orange Couch?

Orange Couch, a storytelling television program, is an intimate exploration of survival. Each episode is shared by ordinary people openly and honestly describing their battle to find themselves in the aftermath of emotional, physical and psychic trauma caused by GBV.

Our storytellers come from all walks of life. None invited, nor believed they would survive their trauma, but they found the courage to survive and thrive. Their stories are our stories, we are them and they are us.

Starting on 25 November 2021, Orange Couch will offer an accredited course for high school and university/college learners that features episodes of the TV show linked to each day of the global observance of **16 Days of Activism against Gender Based Violence**. The Orange Couch Conversations course provides a creative and highly engaging way to earn academic credit for learning how to identify and prevent GBV.
